The 2nd International Conference on Sustainability Education was organised virtually marking the first anniversary of ICSE 2019 which was a landmark event. The two-day webinar conducted on 9-10 September 2020 focussed on **'Sustainability Education and the New Normal'** and **'The Role of Youth in Sustainability Education'** respectively.

The first day was focussed on, 'Sustainability Education and the New Normal' and it was attended by 500+ participants nationally and internationally.

DAY 1

SUSTAINABILITY EDUCATION AND THE NEW NORMAL

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought huge disruption in education forcing around 1.58 billion children and youth out of their campuses. The challenge today is to reduce as much as possible the negative impact this pandemic will have on learning and schooling and build on this experience to get back on a path to build back better the educational system. During ICSE II webinar ICSE 2019 report was launched. The opening remarks were given by the Chief Guest, Shri Amit Khare, Secretary, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India. He gave a comprehensive overview of National Education Policy (NEP) and emphasized that challenging situations like COVID 19 pandemic also provide opportunities to see, do and explore new things. Mr. Eric Falt addressed the audience on gender equality, youth and sustainability education, Dr. Christa Henze emphasized on what can be learned out of COVID19 pandemic crisis and Education of Sustainable Development (ESD), Dr. Henze shared about the ripple effect of COVID in Germany which is very different in communities and family. Professor Rayappa of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) shared use of satellite communication to deal with situation of COVID disruptions in education. Professor Daisy I. Dimkpa of Niger Delta University, Nigeria spoke on the topic on "YouTube: The New Normal in Online Learning and Management of Sustainability Education in Nigeria."

DAY 1 OUTCOMES

- To remould our sustainability efforts, at this unprecedented and changed situation, we need students to develop systemic thinking in being able to learn and then transform into actions at local and regional level.
- To ensure each child gets involved in best sustainability practices across, the school management should make sure each student have easy access to technology, devices and content.

- To bridge the digital divide not only with students and but also with teachers, the satellite school system like EDUSAT can be one solution as satellite communication can be reached to remote areas.

10 Students of Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Gujarat restored a stream called Bhukhi nallah which flows through the centre of University covering 1.8 km distance.



TEAM - LSPS ECO FREAK

A team of 09 Students of Lakshmipat Singhania School, Odisha created a foot operated hand sanitizer dispenser for the small businessmen of their city so that customers can take the services without worrying during the COVID 19 times and these small businessmen do not have to experience loss.



TEAM – STERCUS

The two-day International Webinar was organized as part of the ICSE Forum to commemorate the World Environment Day, by Mobius Foundation, UNESCO New Delhi, The Climate Reality Project India and other eminent partners. The webinar deliberated on the inter-linkages between COVID-19 pandemic, biodiversity and how sustainability education can be a strategic asset to address both the environment and pandemic challenge.

DAY 1

INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR AND PRINCIPALS' CONCLAVE, THURSDAY, JUNE 04, 2020



The first day of the webinar was chaired by Dr. Ram Boojh, CEO Mobius Foundation. It was attended by 160 + participants and online broadcast was further viewed by 6000+ viewers from all across the globe through social media. Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Boojh emphasized on the awareness of environmental actions and interlinkage of biodiversity, COVID 19 and education. He stated that COVID-19 is the greatest disruption in reshaping educational system. Mr. Atul Bhgai, Director (UNEP India) was the chief guest and Mr. Kartikeya Sarabhai, Founder and Director (CEE), Mr. Aditya Pundit, Country Manager (Climate Reality India), Ms. Seema Bali, Vice Principal (St. Mary's School, Dwarka, New Delhi), Ms.

Sumedha Jayaweera, Principal (St. Paul's Girls' School, Columbo, Sri Lanka), Mr. Ben Green, Geography teacher and Head of Outdoor Education (Whitgift School), Mr. Pramod Kumar Sharma, Senior Director Of Education (FEE) were the keynote speakers. After the keynote, principals' conclave started in 10 parallel groups which deliberated Sustainability Education in Covid Era.

FOLLOWING ARE THE KEY OUTCOMES OF DAY 1:

- 1 COVID-19 is the greatest disruption in reshaping educational system.
- 2 Pandemic is also bringing up new trends in our lifestyles such as virtual meetings, informal learning, and sustainability values, including Yoga, Namaste, social distancing, work from home commando virtual offices and teaching learning spaces which are becoming the new normal.
- 3 Humans have always exploited the environment and eco-system and this current crisis has opened new horizons for us humans to work towards more balanced and sustainable lifestyle, where we create an equilibrium between human activities and the environmental activities through sustainability education.
- 4 The implications of COVID 19 can be seen through change in pollution levels and carbon levels which indicates that human activities contribute huge amount in polluting the environment and it has also shown how resilient the nature is. COVID 19 has taught us that we seldom looked upon the threats and their scale.
- 5 Concept of inter-generational education; where a child gets to spend time with their family. Programme like "Care and Share" initiated talks with grandparents and brought out suggestions and solutions from home environment itself.
- 6 School can be turned into live green labs by taking care of the air, water, energy & biodiversity and integrating them into curriculum consciously.
- 7 After the Indian perspective of education, the webinar moved to international perspective of sustainability education.
- 8 Students have a lot of responsibility, they will be tackling with the problems like carbon levels, marine and air pollution and will be asked for solutions. It is our responsibility to prepare them for this challenge and work towards offering them a better future.
- 9 The way forward, is that students should be allocated focused domains of sustainable education as per his/her liking.
- 10 As one is adapting through new conditions, it is essential to have the technology integrated knowledge and skills among the students.
- 11 In E-learning, one of the challenges with weak students is that they cannot cope up with online teaching; they need personal guidance and real classroom environment to generate interest to learn. The possible solution was to have more knowledge exchange among the students, so they learn from each other.
- 12 We have to focus to educate the young minds to use technology with minimum damage caused to nature

Programme started with a brief recap of the proceedings of the Day 1 of the webinar. Highlighting the significance of observing the world environment day during the unprecedented COVID pandemic by celebrating biodiversity and nature

KEY OUTCOMES

- 1 Shift is towards hybrid education and infrastructure has to be build up to support blended learning which is a challenge for policy makers and other stakeholders.
- 2 Skill building will be a new initiative once social distancing is over and students can be empowered with the theme of one people one planet, that encompass 'Vasudhev Kutumbukam', the underlying philosophy of Ancient Indian Scriptures.
- 3 Transformation of the education system in COVID Era should look at pedagogical revolution in sustainability education.
- 4 The ground reality of India and socio-economic factor should also be taken into consideration, alternate method to online learning to be identified and explored for the students that may include broadcasting method on television or on radio, align school to operate in areas for social distancing, pre-recorded lessons through ICT with full consideration for children marked with disability as internet penetration is still an issue.
- 5 Green Jobs should be a part of curriculum encompassing future trends like disasters, risk management, renewable energy that may be aided by global collaborations in the curriculum. Population explosion is also one of the domains to be looked.

Interactive Question and Answers session during the webinar brought some interesting issues which were taken up by panellists. Here are the highlights:

- Issues related to majority vs minority population should not be the point of discussion for population stabilisation. These parameters are irrelevant to work upon, the focus should be on social and economic status.
- Strong communication strategy should be devised to reach youth and bring about change.
- Instead of comprehensive sex education we should focus on comprehensive health education which includes awareness on child marriage, contraception, social issues in adolescent etc.
- As fertility rate declines in India, sex ratio is going to get worse and reach adverse proportions just like China. This will in turn impact gender equality as well. Strict legal measures need to be put in place to maintain sex ratio. Policies like **"Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao"** should be strongly advocated.



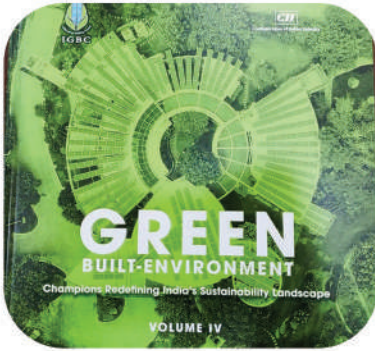

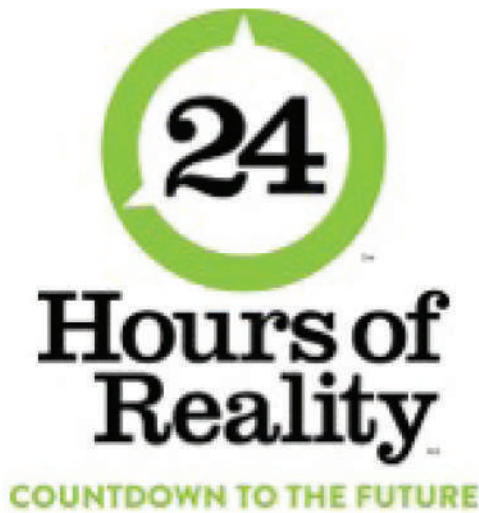
GYAN ANANT VIDYALAYA (GAV)

GAV, Atrouli took off its wing during the crisis hit situation of pandemic Covid-19. Since the school's inception in 2020, it started with the most challenging phase of giving education to the students of rural areas via online methodology. Facing lack of digitalization in that particular area to providing with latest technologies for giving them a hands-on experience in learning was the greatest endeavor of the teachers and all staff members.

To keep the fire of learning alive and provide education to rural children, the school provided its students with tablets and chrome books at half price. Students and parents were guided about the usage and handling. The zoom ids were bought by the school for giving them smooth learning where they didn't have to change their online classrooms repeatedly. Teachers were facilitated with Laptops and work from home facilities. Soon the teaching and learning process became the most desirable routine of everyone's life.

GAV started getting acknowledgements from all sides and soon received a shield of honour from highly acknowledged global organisation '**Great Place to Work**'. GAV also got noticed for its exceptionally brilliant architecture and received a **Platinum Award by Indian Green Building Council**.

Having crossed the threshold of 300 students within a short span of one year, we proudly stand welcoming new learners aboard with spirited and hard-working staff.



Mobius Foundation conducted a 30-minute session via zoom to raise awareness about climate change and its effect on various elements on our Planet on 16th Oct 2020 (Friday). Mr. Pradip Burman, Chairman, Mobius Foundation welcomed the participants from Mobius and Ayurvet Ltd. He gave an introductory speech on climate change and significant activities by Mobius to educate people about the effects of climate change.

The session was taken over by Dr. Ram Boojh, CEO, Mobius Foundation who gave deep insights about Climate Change and Biodiversity. The concluding session was taken by Ms. Archana Kushwaha, Assistant Manager, Mobius Foundation by giving a presentation to aware the participants about the small steps that can be taken by each individual to combat climate change.

CELEBRATING WORLD WATER DAY 2021

Every year, 22nd March is observed as the World Water Day (WWD). The 2021 WWD was celebrated to reiterate the importance of water in the age of climate change. The theme of the year **'Valuing Water'** specifically recognizes the crucial role of healthy ecosystems in maintaining water supplies around the world. Amid a water, nature and climate crisis, the reciprocal relationship between water and ecosystems is a concept we must more fully embrace.

Mobius Foundation celebrated The World Water Day on 22nd March 2021 to support the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030. Everybody participated and shared views on how we can better contribute to protect this vital resource.





POPULATION STABILISATION



During pandemic times and throughout the unlock stages, project Aakar on population stabilization continued the engagements in the rural communities of Bahraich and Barabanki districts in UP.

Under the project additional registration drives of ASHA's in focus intervention villages were taken up. Which now have 400 Asha Didi's registered in comparison to 200 number earlier.

Around 5000 Unique Young Couples in rural communities were served by addressing their needs, monthly basis. The field staff captured the demand of contraceptives from ASHA's in their community and delivered monthly demands of contraceptives. New set of families especially the newlyweds were registered for counselling by community counsellors over tele conversations and WhatsApp.

The wall painting drive started during the lockdown with the help of accomplished local painters in both districts. Till date, over 500 walls are painted with family planning message with the consent of Asha workers and native people.

Mobius Foundation celebrated the '**Happy Family Day**' or '**Khushaal Parivar Diwas**' on 21st of every month in sync with the U.P. government's initiative to promote Family Planning. The Foundation organised camps at Community Health Centers (CHC's) in Barabanki and Bahraich districts. This event had resounding success with families stepping up to learn more about family planning and adopt contraceptives measures.

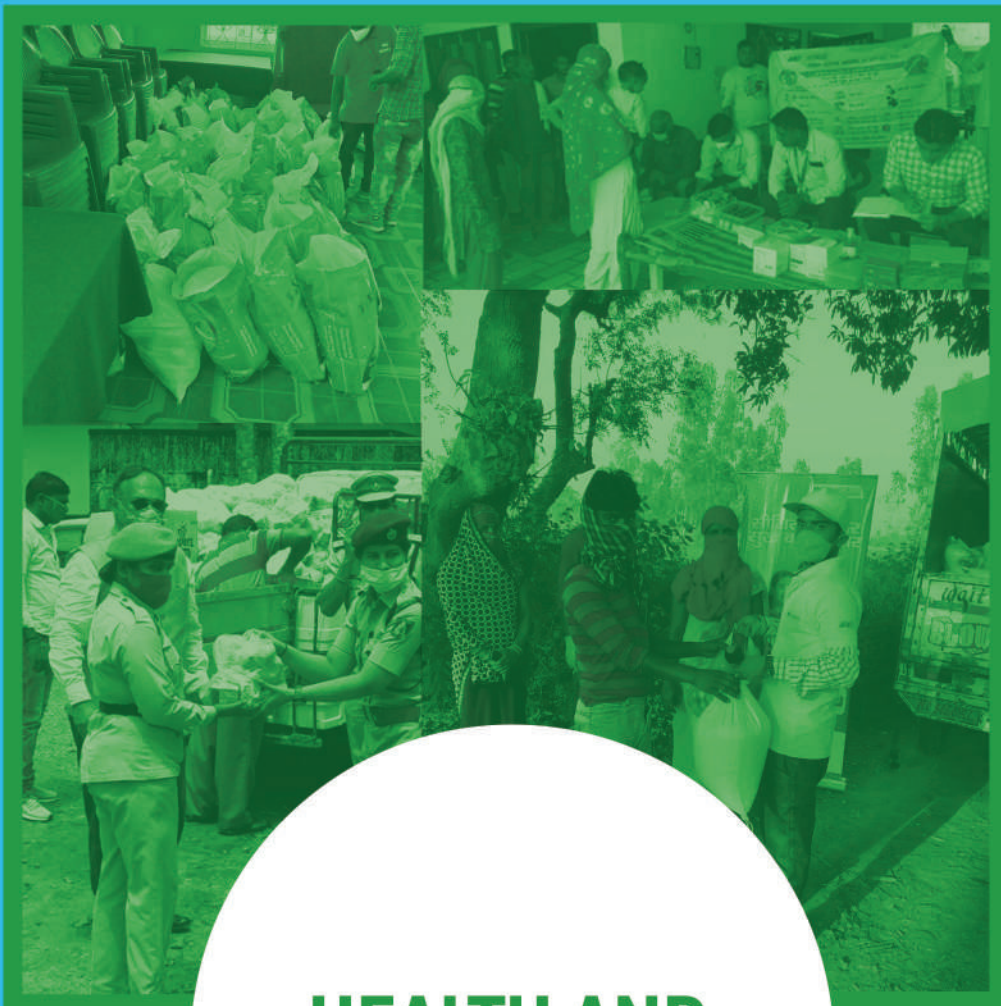

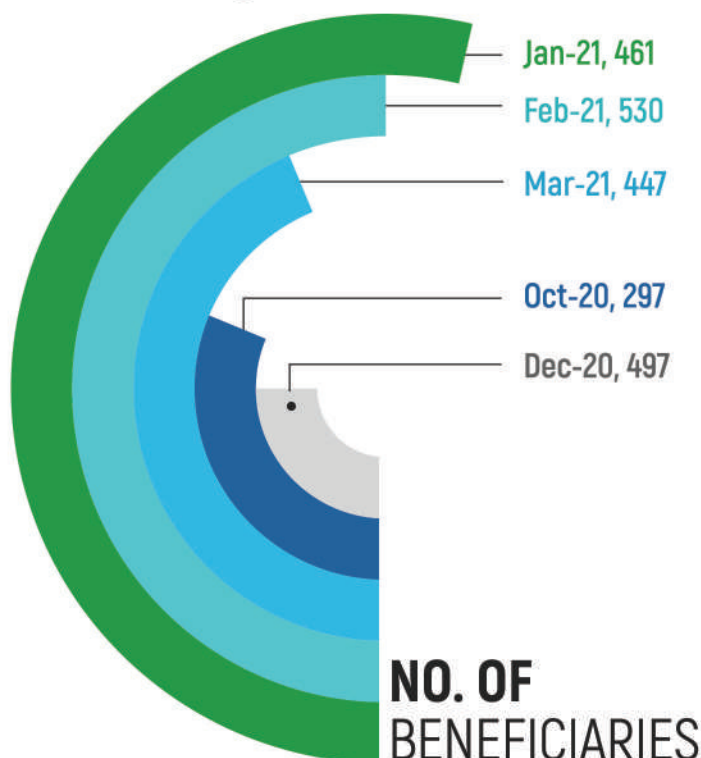

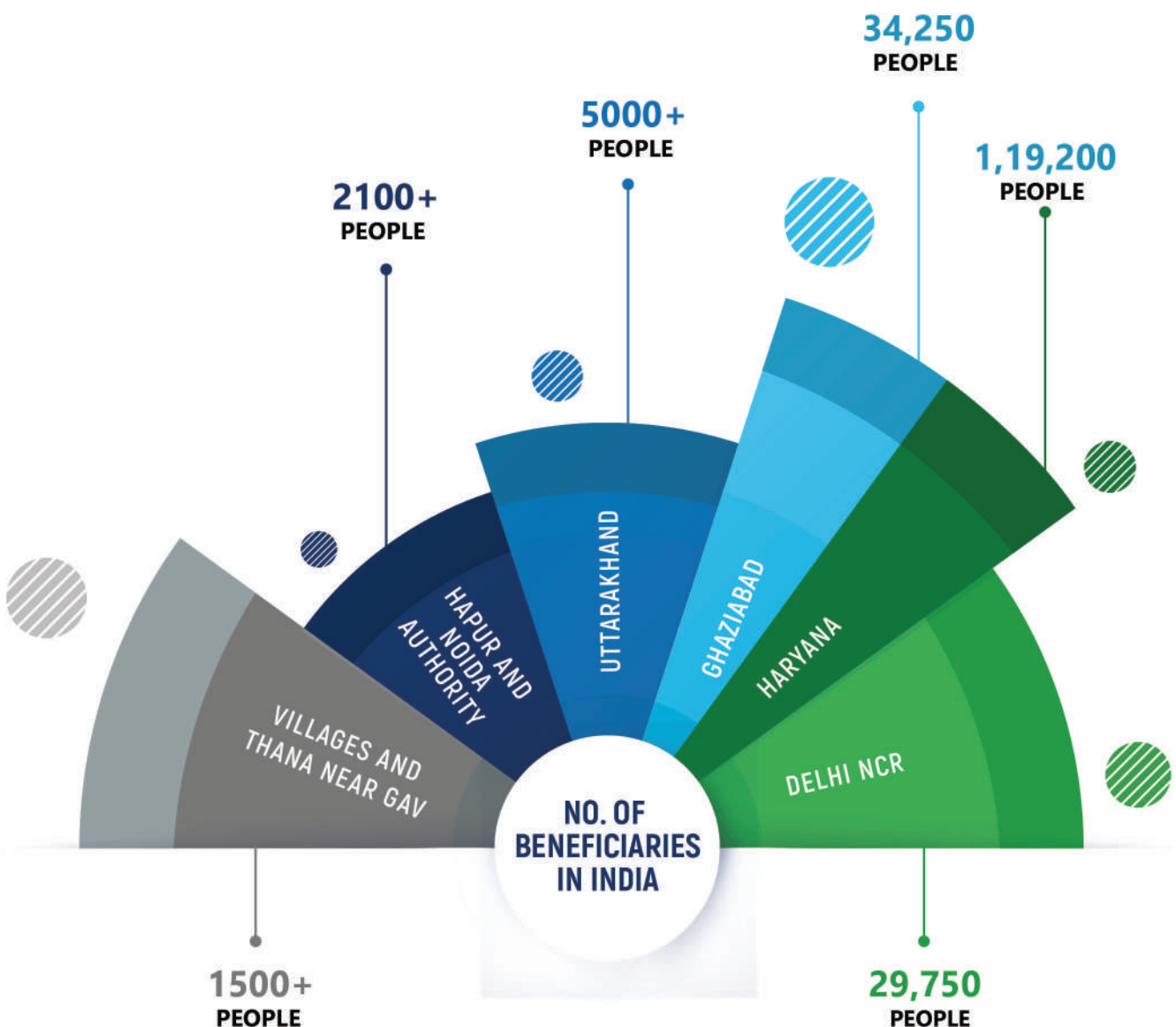
MOBILE HEALTH CAMPS



Keeping in mind the long-standing needs of healthcare facilities, Mobius Foundation has launched the '**Mobile Health Camp**' initiative to provide basic healthcare facilities to rural communities of Haryana's Sonipat and Panipat districts. To carry out this project, the foundation's strong leadership used a systematic approach in close collaboration with local communities as well as the SATHI team. The camp had a number of limitations, including the challenges of Covid-19, lack of support for a few health issues, and unavailability of testing facilities. The number of beneficiaries, which amounted to up to 2210 villagers, was the main highlight of the mobile health camp. The initiative demonstrated many positive outcomes, such as easier and better access to healthcare, female health checkups, improved delivery of facilities etc.

COVID RELIEF

The Covid-19 pandemic brought the entire world to a halt, imposing lockdowns in every country. Lockdowns went into effect in India on March 24, 2020, affecting many daily wage labourers and workers. The Mobius Foundation began relief efforts in response to the unprecedented crisis. The foundation decided to launch the '**Covid-19 Relief and Sanitation Project**' and donated Rs 1 crore to the PM Cares Fund. Food and personal protection kits were distributed in Coorg (Karnataka), Uttarakhand, Village Chidana, Sonipat, Hapur, Ghaziabad, Noida, Modinagar, and various Delhi / NCR locations. Essentials like medical kits, ration and other vital resources were distributed to District Medical Authority, Police Officials, District Education Department, Daily Wage Earners and Orphanages in Kodagu district of Coorg. The foundation collaborated with Lite Bite Foods to distribute Food Packets. There were 72,600 people who benefitted from the relief efforts. The relief work was carried out with the assistance of government officials as well. Along with essential food items, basic medical kits containing sanitizers and masks were distributed to the villagers. This initiative aimed to assist people who had been severely affected by the pandemic, as well as to prevent further spread through sanitization and support for medical infrastructure. Project Aakar extended its support to Department of Health Uttar Pradesh in the face of Covid 19. The team lost no time to galvanise into action. Donated 500 PPE -kits and 3000 masks to Lucknow Covid Care Command Office.

Hence, this initiative is driven by objective of encouraging people's participation into plantation activities. Phase III of the project was inaugurated on 5th June 2020 to mark World Environment Day at Ayurved Research Foundation, Gaushala, and Haryana in presence of SDM. Our project implementation partner SATHI managed the plantation drive and ensured community participation and ownership for better care and survival of tress. Sanjeevani Project has been started with the noble cause to heal the earth by increasing green cover through plantation and environmental awareness.

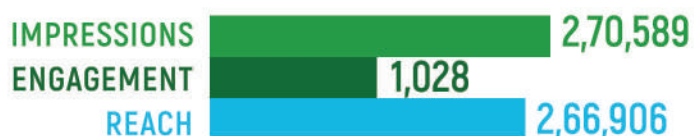

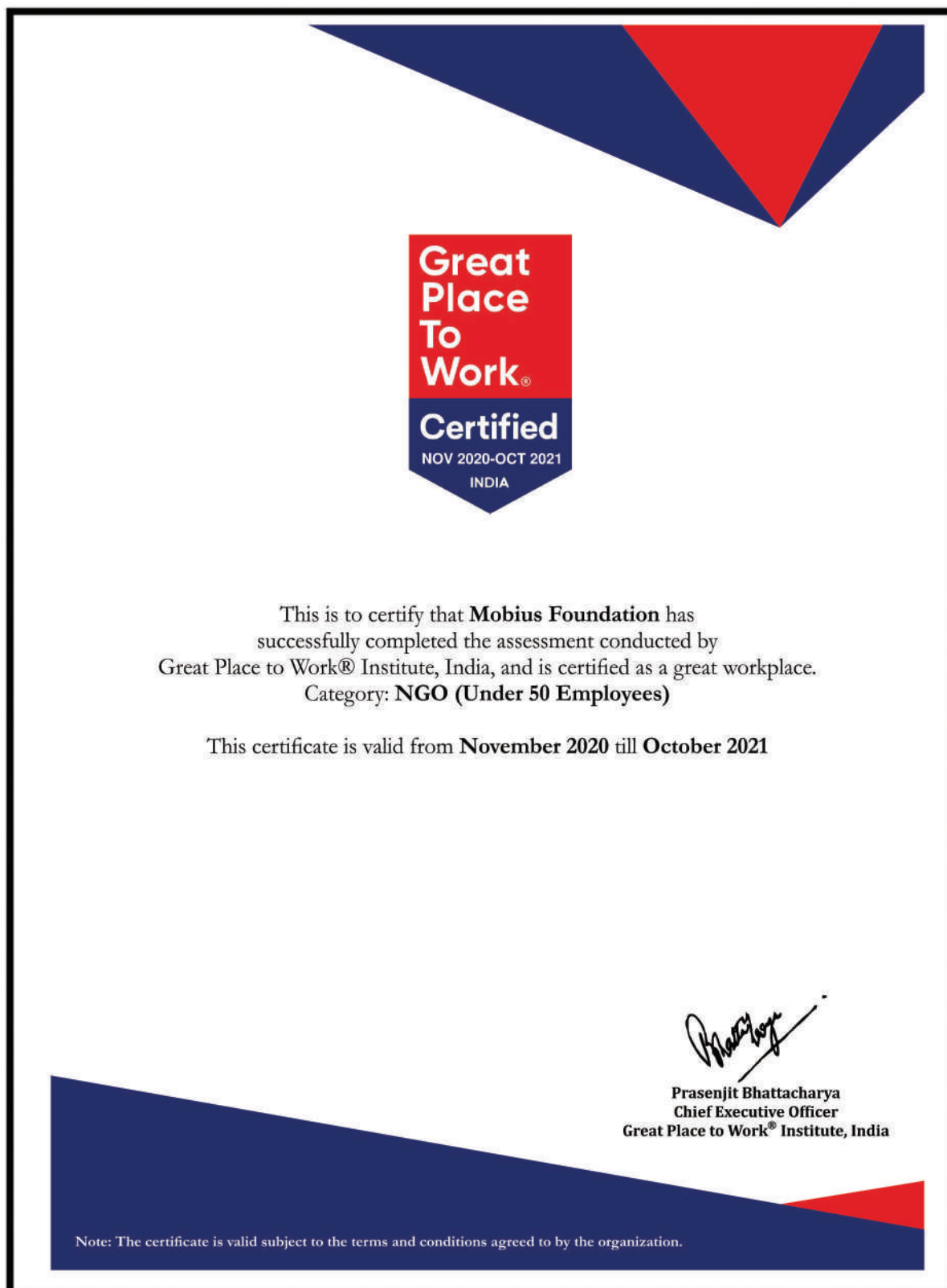
