



Imperilled kidneys of nature

Governmental endeavours, though praiseworthy, lack the depth required for safeguarding the vast expanse of wetlands scattered across India, all of which yearn for equal attention

Wetlands, one of the most productive ecosystems on the planet, which called the 'kidneys of nature' for being most effective at filtering and storing excess nutrients, and storing and approximately 75 per cent of carbon sequestration since 2000. The World Wetlands of South Asia (WWSA), a sub-programme of the Ramsar Convention, has estimated that India has lost at least 10 per cent of its wetlands since the late 1980s. Other wetlands are facing an increasingly dire future and several wetlands are disappearing at an alarming rate compared to natural ones.

Wetland recognition

In 2002, India incorporated wetlands and its wetlands into the list of Ramsar sites, using the Ramsar Convention, which is the only international treaty for the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands. It is crucial to recognise the role that wetlands play in the lives of other organisms. However, urgent attention is required to conserve and protect these wetlands. According to the National Wetland Atlas India 2011, the country has approximately 100,000 wetlands, which are scattered across the country. The Ramsar Convention, which is the only international treaty for the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands, was signed in 1971. India has been a signatory to the convention since 1991.
