With over 290 registrations from India and neighbouring countries including Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, and the Maldives, the campaign reflects a strong regional commitment to sustainability. A key highlight was the webinar held on 7th June, 2025 during World Environment Week, which brought together over 300 participants to engage with Y4E's mission and vision.



Participants are required to submit their final project reports by 31st July, 2025, using the official format available on the Y4E/ICSE website. A revamped evaluation process is in place to assess impactful, solution-driven initiatives across Junior and Senior categories. The most outstanding projects will be showcased at the 7th ICSE, to be held on 17th–18th September, 2025 at the India Habitat Centre, New Delhi.

Mobius Young Climate Leaders (MYCL) for Himalayan Development

May, 2025 - Regional Visit:

The Mobius Young Development Professionals team in Nagaland conducted a regional visit across the North Eastern states, engaging with NGOs, state coordinators, and young professionals to align on project goals, implementation strategies, and expected outcomes. The team introduced the Mobius Foundation's vision, shared operational guidelines, and emphasized collaboration for grassroots impact. As part of the Green Friday initiative, segregated waste bins were distributed to participating schools to encourage weekly student-led collection of paper and plastic waste, promoting awareness and sustainable habits among youth.




North East India Project Commencement Program:

June, 2025: MYCL initiative marked a major milestone with its official launch in Nagaland, signifying the expansion of the programme across North-eastern states (Assam, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Tripura, Sikkim). The launch event, held in Kohima, saw the participation of over 50 delegates, including policymakers, academic experts, youth leaders and civil society representatives. During this high-level engagement, Mr. Pradip Burman (Chairman), Mr. Praveen Garg (President) and Dr. Ram Boojh (Advisor), along with Ms. Banajyotsna Baruah (Sr. Program Manager) and Ms. Suman Kumari (Project Associate) also met with the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Nagaland Shri Neiphiu Rio and other key government officials to discuss the programme's long-term vision and impact.







The program began with a welcome address by Ms. Hekani Jakhalu, Hon'ble Advisor, Industries & Commerce, Govt. of Nagaland followed by an overview by Dr. Atoho Jakhalu, Project Lead. The event's highlight was the address by Shri T. R. Zeliang, Hon'ble Dy. Chief Minister of Nagaland. He encouraged youth to drive the climate agenda and praised the MYCL initiative. Shri Abu Metha, Advisor to CM, Govt. of Nagaland concluded the session with a strong message on sustainable development.

Following the launch, the Foundation hosted an interactive session with six leading NGOs and MYCL state coordinators, aimed at exploring localised climate solutions and building collaborative opportunities. These efforts mark a powerful step forward in equipping the next generation of climate leaders to champion resilience and sustainable development across the Himalayan region.

The Gyan Kanya Shakti (GKS) project, spearheaded by Mobius Foundation, has made remarkable strides this quarter in empowering adolescent girls through holistic education and life skills.

Expansion & Reach

- Districts Covered: 8 (including new entries: Jhansi, Jalaun, Lalitpur)
- KGBVs Implemented: 17 (existing) + 8 (from July onwards)

Education & Learning Impact

- Academic Sessions Delivered: 713 in April, 714 in May (91–93% planned coverage)
- High-Performing Schools: Manikpur, Mau, Pahari
- MiVirtue Life Skills Sessions: 136 sessions completed (April-mid May)
- Life Skills Impact: 425 girls assessed across 17 schools; Learning growth: Baseline 30.6% → Endline 64%

Capacity Building - All four district coordinators completed certified training in:

- Digital Pedagogy & Al Tools
- Inclusive Education & Disability Support
- Early Childhood Development (SDGs)
- Legal Awareness & Adolescent Psychology

These courses equipped the team with tools to foster inclusivity, integrate emerging technologies, and align with national education reforms.

- Final report & impact data awaited



Data & Digital Systems - GKS App & School Data Maintenance

- District Coordinators and Ayojikas collected and uploaded academic and student data to the **GKS mobile app** (under development).
- Data includes previous results, new admissions, and other key school-level details.

Academic Planning & Rollout - Planning for Academic Year 2025-26

- Internal meetings with partner organizations were held to strategize the upcoming session.
- GKS will now operate in 25 schools across six districts: Sheopur, Panna, Satna, Sidhi, Umaria, and Shahdol.

Capacity Building & Program Expansion

- Phase III Expansion 10 new government girls' schools adopted in Umaria and Shahdol; Grade 6 classes to begin in July 2025, with approvals from District Collectors.
- Recruitment & New Joinees Two new District Coordinators, Mr. Saurabh Singh (Shahdol) and Mr. Ankit Mishra (Sheopur); Recruitment process began in May, 2025.

Stakeholder Engagement & Outreach

- Meetings with Govt. Officials & School Visits to align plans for 2025–26.
- Ongoing GKS activities and upcoming plans shared with Education Department officials and school stakeholders.
- Feedback from Principals and Teachers Schools report a gradual but visible impact of GKS interventions on student performance and engagement.

- Need assessment conducted by Instrucko Team for students of Grades 9 and 10.
- PEP will launch in 2025–26 with modules like email etiquette, financial literacy, and life skills.

Health Mela - Puraini Jarwal

Umeed 1.0:

From April to June 2025, a series of Health Melas and outreach activities in Jarwal Block, Bahraich connected rural communities with vital services. The Mela in Haidarabad saw 512 participants, offering counselling, family planning, adolescent health support, and sanitary pad distribution. In Puraini, the Mela reached 448 people with similar services, including Ayushman card issuance and health checkups. June marked the 18th Mela, alongside ongoing ANM cluster meetings and trainings to strengthen frontline health workers and boost community-based health interventions.

Umeed 2.0:

Between May and June 2025, Umeed 2.0 advanced family planning efforts through intensive ASHA and ANM training sessions across selected blocks and districts, aimed at strengthening technical knowledge and counselling skills. Key field visits—such as to CHCs in Barabanki and Chhapaiya (Gonda)—by Dr. Ram Boojh, Mobius and PFI teams, reviewed onground implementation, gathered feedback, and engaged with healthcare officials, field staff, and beneficiaries. In June, dedicated Umeed Counselling Centres were launched in Sitapur and other districts to enhance service quality and accessibility. Rogi Kalyan Samiti sessions and interdepartmental coordination further supported consistent, community-responsive service delivery.



Mobius Foundation has expanded the Aakar Project to **Saran** district in Bihar, building on its success in Siddharthnagar. In partnership with the Janani team, this three-year initiative aims to strengthen grassroots reproductive healthcare by improving access to quality family planning services. Key interventions include Clinical Outreach Teams (COT), healthcare infrastructure support, capacity building, and community mobilization through cluster meetings and VHSND platforms.



Siddharthnagar:

In **Siddharthnagar**, Project Aakar made notable progress between May and June 2025 through targeted Fixed Day Services (FDS), outreach, and counselling initiatives. Across multiple FDS sessions, 52 female sterilizations and 2 non-scalpel vasectomies (NSVs) were performed -led by surgeons Dr. Vivek Mishra and Dr. P. Kanaujia-alongside IUCD insertions. Outreach camps, 13 cluster meetings, and 64 VHSND sessions engaged over 1,000 community members, focusing on counselling newlyweds and eligible couples. Contraceptive distribution reached 35 individuals with 72 OCP cycles and 205 condoms. A key **review visit** on 24th June by the **Mobius team** assessed service delivery at CHC Khesraha and Panchayat Bhawan Dubai, gathering insights from frontline workers and stakeholders. Dr. Sujit Kumar Pandey, MOIC, appreciated Mobius Foundation's support and called for stronger male involvement and regular counselling.

Glimpses from the Field Visits

In May and June 2025, field visits were conducted at Sakhi MPC in Rajasthan and Indujaa MPC in Maharashtra to review the on-ground implementation of the household biogas project. The visit aimed to assess both the progress of plant installations and the effectiveness of project branding. As of 30th June, a total of **765 biogas plants** have been successfully installed across all 3 states (Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh), marking significant progress in promoting clean energy access and sustainable rural livelihoods.

On Earth Day, 22nd April, 2025, Mobius Foundation hosted a high-impact panel discussion at Bikaner House, New Delhi, on "Water Towers of Asia: Cryosphere, Climate Change, and Solutions," aligning with the International Year of Glacier Preservation. Focusing on the Hindu Kush Himalayas, or the Third Pole, the event featured leading experts who highlighted the urgent need for climate action, glacier monitoring, and cross-border cooperation.

Mr. Praveen Garg, President, Mobius Foundation, emphasized protecting Asia's vital water towers through science-driven solutions and youth engagement. Attended by over 140 participants, the session reinforced Mobius Foundation's commitment to environmental sustainability and climate resilience.

Our Great National Parks:


Episode 1: "A World of Wonder" - This opening chapter offers a sweeping global panorama—from the pristine beaches of Africa and Japan's ancient forests to Australia's Great Barrier Reef. Viewers are treated to stunning visuals and introductory context for the conservation themes that are across the series.

Episode 2: "Chilean Patagonia" - Explore 24 national parks in Chilean Patagonia, a region of glaciers, emerald lakes, fjords, and Andean peaks. The episode explores efforts to rewild landscapes and protect endemic species, demonstrating Patagonia's potential as a model for large-scale conservation.

Episode 3: "Tsavo, Kenya" - Meet the diverse wildlife of Tsavo National Park—home to elephants, rhinos, hippos, and hornbills—roaming across vast savanna landscapes and riverine corridors. This episode delves into the delicate balance of wildlife, habitat, and human coexistence.

Episode 4: "Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary, USA" - This episode shifts oceanside to California's coastal paradise. Viewers journey into kelp forests, underwater canyons, and marine mammal habitat—highlighting the fragile equilibrium between ocean ecosystems and human activity.







Episode 5: "Gunung Leuser, Indonesia" - Centering on Indonesia's rich rainforest, this episode focuses on Gunung Leuser National Park, a haven for critically endangered species such as the Sumatran tiger, orangutans, and rhinoceros. The narrative emphasizes forest conservation and indigenous community roles in safeguarding biodiversity.

Ocean with David Attenborough (2025):

The powerful documentary explores the beauty and fragility of the world's oceans. Narrated by Sir David Attenborough, it reveals how industrial fishing—particularly bottom trawling—is devastating marine ecosystems and biodiversity. The film features stunning footage of ocean life, while exposing the destruction caused by overfishing and pollution.

Despite the urgent tone, it offers hope by showcasing marine areas that have recovered through protection and sustainable practices. Attenborough calls for immediate global action to safeguard the ocean, emphasizing that if we protect it now, it can bounce back for future generations.
