7th International Conference on Sustainability Education (ICSE) - 2025

The International Conference on Sustainability Education (ICSE) 2025 was successfully held on **September 17-18 at the India Habitat Centre, New Delhi**. With the theme **"Sustainability Education for Green Jobs,"** the event focused on equipping youth and professionals for emerging green careers and climate-resilient futures.

The conference opened with a formal ceremony featuring addresses by key leaders from the organizing and partner institutions. The keynote speech was delivered by a global voice on sustainability and education, followed by remarks from national and international guests. The Chief Guest concluded the session with an encouraging message on India's green future. A heart-warming welcome song performed by students of GAV School, set a hopeful and positive tone for the proceedings.

Over the two days, plenary sessions examined how education can drive sustainability and employment, with discussions on technology, green skills, and innovation. These were supported by a practical workshop on green job skills and two interactive SAMVAADs to foster dialogue and collaboration.

Notable sustainability influencers **Dr. Purnima Devi Barman, Aalekh Kapoor, and Anuj Ramatri** also brought youth perspectives and innovation into the spotlight.

ICSE 2025 stood out as a valuable platform for turning ideas into action and aligning education with the needs of a sustainable future.



Legal Symposium - Advocating Change: From Climate Justice to Climate Action

The Mobius Foundation recently organized a legal symposium titled **“Advocating Change: From Climate Justice to Climate Action”** on **September 24, 2025, at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi**. The event centered on the recent advisory opinion issued by the International Court of Justice (ICJ), which reaffirmed that climate change presents an “urgent and existential threat” to people, ecosystems, and future generations. The symposium explored the opinion’s wider implications for global climate accountability, highlighting the legal obligations of states under international law and its potential to catalyze stronger climate action across the world.



The gathering brought together a diverse mix of journalists, legal experts, advocates, and policymakers to discuss both international and domestic legal challenges in the realm of environmental law and policy. The event was chaired by **Hon’ble Justice Mr. Prakash Srivastava**, Chairperson of the **National Green Tribunal (NGT)**. Special remarks were delivered by **Honourable Chief Justice Antonio H. Benjamin**, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Justice, Brazil; **Ms. Urmi Goswami**, Assistant Editor (Climate Change & Environment), The Economic Times; and **Mr. Jatinder Jay Cheema**, Barrister & Solicitor, Advocate, and Author, Chambers of Jay Cheema. The session was moderated by **Ms. Jessica Gill**, Programme Lead, Mobius Foundation.

The symposium served as a dynamic platform for legal and policy dialogue on climate justice, attracting students, delegates, and professionals from related sectors. Participation certificates were distributed, encouraging ongoing engagement at the intersection of law and climate action.

Gyan Kanya Shakti (GKS): 100 Schools Program

The Gyan Kanya Shakti Program in UP and MP, continues to play a pivotal role in empowering teenage girls through integrated education and skill development opportunities.

Key interventions included the distribution of **stationery and study materials** to support academic readiness, the organization of **health camps** aimed at promoting holistic well-being, and the successful administration of **AQA exams** to evaluate academic progress. In line with efforts to enhance the learning environment, significant strides were made in **infrastructure development and IT instalments** across selected schools. Furthermore, **Menstrual Health Management (MHM)** workshops were conducted to empower adolescent girls with essential health and hygiene awareness.

Mission Shakti – Empowering Girls through Leadership: Under **Mission Shakti**, a special Navratri activity, leadership among girls was encouraged as they took on roles like BEO, BDO, ADO, Medical Officer, and Warden for a day, fostering confidence, responsibility, and empowerment.

17 students (15 girls, 2 boys) from GAV participated in the 3rd District Yoga Championship held at JMS World School, Hapur, alongside 250 students from 10 schools. Demonstrating exceptional talent and discipline, they won **23 medals**—10 Gold, 6 Silver, and 7 Bronze—across various age categories, securing **2nd overall position** among all participating schools. Following this achievement, **eight students** represented GAV at the **State-Level Yoga Championship** at Acharya Narendra Dev University of Agriculture and Technology, Ayodhya, competing across multiple categories and showcasing commendable performance.

Project Aakar

Janani Siddharthnagar

This quarter, under Project Aakar's Janani initiative, substantial progress was made in Siddharthnagar across both service delivery and community mobilization. A total of 9 Fixed Day Static (FDS) camps were conducted, resulting in 50 sterilizations—49 female and 1 male—across Dumariyaganj (6), Mithwal (1), Khuniyawn (4), Bansi (2), Lotan (3), Uska (3), and Barhni (4). Community engagement efforts included 100 VHSND sessions, reaching 1,136 individuals, and 16 cluster meetings with 117 participants at CHCs. Additionally, 10 Family Planning Counselling Centre (FPCC) sessions benefited 121 individuals. In terms of contraceptive distribution, 67 OCP cycles were provided to 23 clients and 155 condoms to 7 clients. Field visits during the quarter emphasized increasing male participation, improving the method mix, and leveraging community platforms to enhance awareness and uptake of spacing methods.

Umeed 2.0 - Multi-District Implementation

Umeed 2.0 advanced family planning interventions across seven districts—Shravasti, Balrampur, Unnao, Gonda, Bahraich, Barabanki, and Sitapur—through a mix of community outreach, capacity building, and institutional engagement. Key activities included Refresher Training of Trainers in Lucknow for master trainers from seven districts, covering rights-based counselling, FPCC tools, and early marriage norms; CHO and facility staff training with study materials, flipbooks, and demo kits; and mobile van SBCC campaigns in Sitapur, Unnao, Barabanki, and Bahraich, offering FP counselling to 8–10 individuals per village, distributing condoms, pills, and IEC materials, and engaging communities through games and quizzes.

FPCCs were launched and inspected in multiple districts, with strong institutional ownership observed. New motivators like "Counsellor of the Month" and "Best CHC Award" were introduced to drive quality. AI-based adolescent education sessions (Snehal) were held in schools in Barabanki and Jarwal, promoting health and relationship dialogue. Additionally, Block Coordination Committee and inter-departmental meetings helped review SBCC campaigns and reinforce adolescent and family planning awareness. District-level engagement with CMOs and ACMOs ensured continued support and visibility for the initiative.

Umeed 1.0 - Jarwal Block - Key Interventions

In August and September 2025, Umeed 1.0 intensified its efforts to strengthen family planning awareness and service uptake in Jarwal block through targeted community outreach and capacity-building activities. Key interventions included a School Chatbot AI training session, orientation for PRI members to engage local leaders in promoting family planning, and refresher trainings for ASHAs and frontline workers. Field Facilitators played a crucial role in supporting VHND sessions and SBCC campaigns across 118 villages, addressing important themes such as early marriage, spacing methods, and gender equality. A Health Mela was also organized, providing on-site services and counselling to community members. These initiatives collectively enhanced community engagement, expanded contraceptive awareness, and reinforced partnerships with local governance structures to drive sustainable behavioral change.

Project Launch - Saran, Bihar

The Aakar Project was officially launched in Saran District, Bihar, in the presence of key representatives from the Mobius and Janani teams, including Dr. Ram Boojh, Ms. Banajyotsna Baruah, Mr. Aryan Banerjee, Mr. Richard Boustred, and Dr. Ram Kumar Parker. Government officials such as Dr. Sagar Dulal Sinha (Civil Surgeon), Mr. Arvind Kumar (DPM), Dr. Suman Kumar (DIO), and Ms. Aarti Tripathi, UNICEF. The event featured ceremonial lamp lighting, keynote addresses, the unveiling of the Aakar Mobile Van, and two street plays promoting population stabilization. It concluded with a placard-led procession by nursing staff to raise community awareness.


Dr. Ram Boojh and Mr. Aryan Banerjee from Mobius Foundation attended a BCC meeting in Khairabad, chaired by BDO Neeraj Dubey, with participation from key departments including Health, PRI, Education, and ICDS. Emphasis was placed on collaborative efforts for family planning and adolescent health. The SBCC van "Itni Bhi Kya Jaldi Hai" was flagged off to raise awareness on child marriage and FP. At Ashodar School, the van engaged students and frontline workers through interactive media and Q&A sessions, with prizes awarded to participants.


Human: The World Within:

Over several years, the film shows how these girls work to overcome poverty, discrimination, and family pressure while striving for a better future. The series highlights both the power of education and the emotional challenges of trying to break free from deeply rooted social barriers.



SunGanges:

follows a journey through India to uncover the links between vanishing rivers, pollution, and the country's growing energy demands. The filmmakers examine how coal and hydroelectric projects harm the environment and communities, while also highlighting the promise of solar and wind energy. Through real-life stories and striking visuals, the film encourages a shift toward cleaner, more sustainable power sources.
